

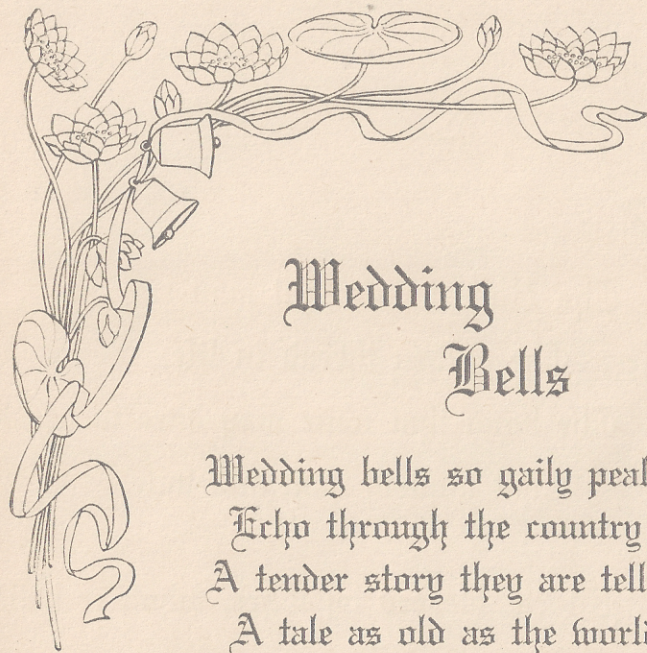

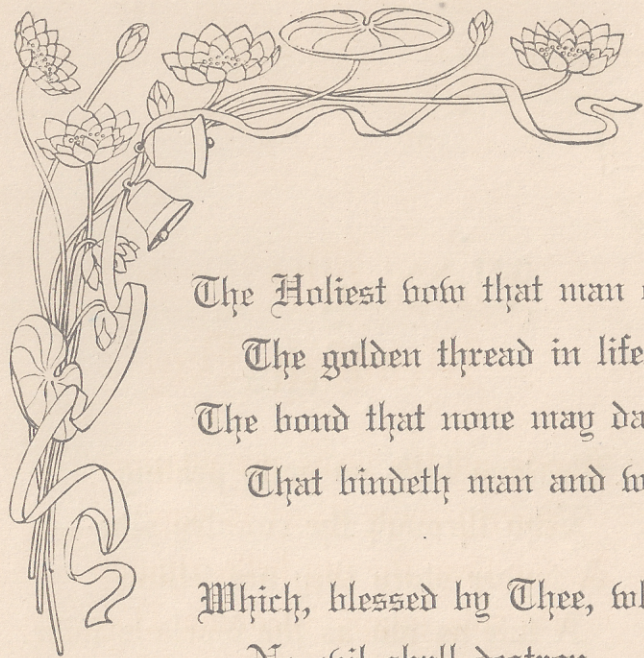

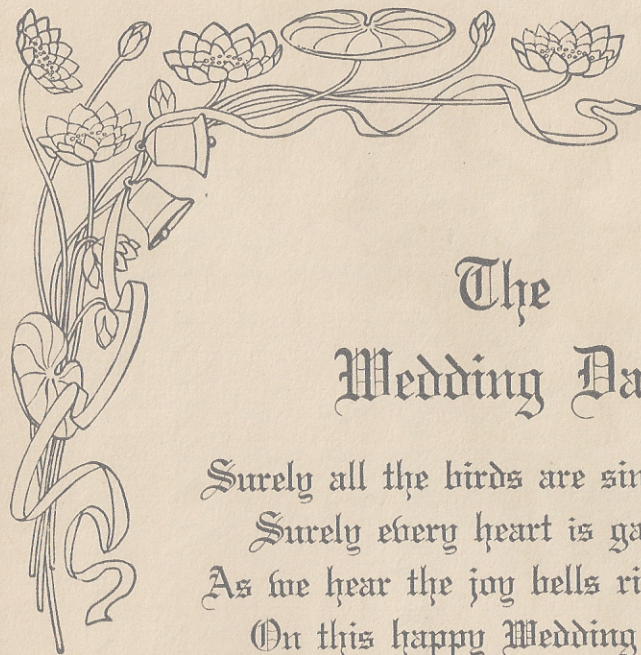
Wedding Bells

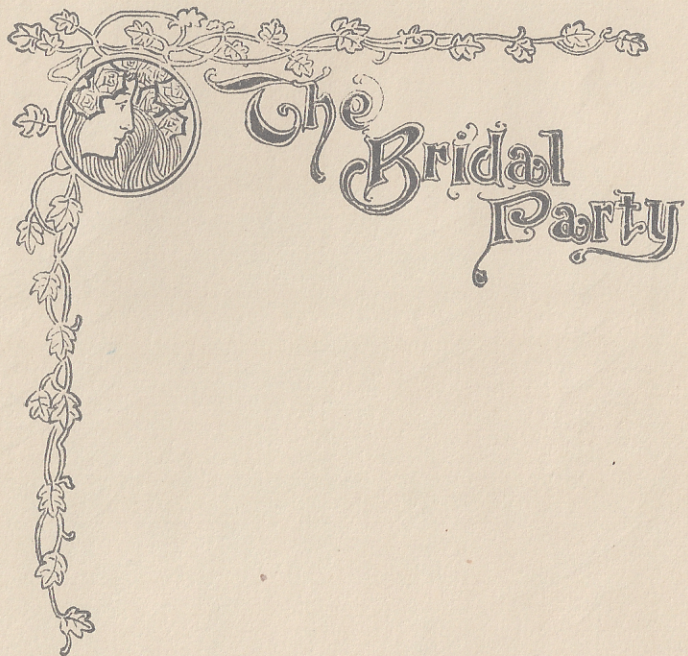
